Oral Language	<p>The student will demonstrate growth in the use of oral language.</p> <p>The student will hear, say, and manipulate phonemes of spoken language</p>	<p>Oral reading subskills training follows a developmental sequence from letter names and sounds to words, phrases and sentences up to a grade 10 reading level.</p> <p>The Academy of Reading offers a comprehensive module of phonemic awareness training exercises. Students begin with matching words that rhyme, moving on to matching words with the same beginning, then ending, then middle sounds. Students progress to matching words with sounds in the beginning, ending and middle position. Then, exercises requiring the blending of three then four phonemes are followed by exercises requiring the segmentation of words with three then four phonemes.</p>
Reading / Literature	<p>The student will understand how print is organized and read.</p> <p>The student will develop an understanding of basic phonetic principles.</p> <p>The student will demonstrate comprehension of stories.</p> <p>The student will identify both uppercase and lowercase letters of the alphabet.</p>	<p>The Reading Subskills module familiarizes students with English orthography through intense exposure to the consonant/vowel combinations that make up the language.</p> <p>Both the Reading Subskills and Phonemic Awareness modules offer rich opportunities for the student to develop graphophonemic knowledge. In the Auditory-Visual Match exercises of the SubSkills section of the Academy of Reading, students practice matching what they hear with one of three on-screen options. Training begins with individual letter names and follows a developmental sequence from letter sounds to multi-letter words and nonsense words. The use of nonsense words ensures that students are actually decoding text and not relying on sight word reading strategies.</p> <p>Another opportunity to develop graphophonemic knowledge is found in Series II of the Phonemic Awareness Training section of the Academy. Having focused on isolated phonemes in Series I, Series II of Phonemic Awareness Training repeats the exercises of Series I, but with the added instructional feature of Target Text. Students hear the word pronounced by the computer and have an alphabetic representation of the spoken word. Students who work through these exercises not only reinforce their phonological awareness but also develop their graphophonemic knowledge.</p>

All of the skills developed by the program allow students to utilize these skills when reading. With these foundational skills deeply entrenched, students are able to attend to meaning and use it for comprehending what is being read.</p> <p>The incorporation of the principles of automaticity and mastery learning allow students to develop decoding skills that enable accuracy and fluency. Without the concurrent development of accuracy and fluency, students continue to struggle with reading improvement.</p> <p>The Silent and Oral Reading Comprehension exercises offer students an opportunity to practice newly developed decoding skills as well as acquire reading comprehension skills. Training exercises involve both retention and comprehension and help students develop strategies for better comprehension, including the development of reading vocabulary, make inferences, not specific facts and details, and retain information.</p> <p>The paragraph content for the Academy of Reading was selected from a variety of real-world sources to help develop life skills while practicing their reading comprehension.</p> <p>The Academy of Reading Library features a variety of graded short stories and fables that students gain access to after demonstrating mastery of the paragraphs at the same reading level located in the Silent Reading Comprehension module.</p>

For example, in the Auditory-Visual Match exercises of the SubSkills section of the Academy, students practice matching what they hear with one of three on-screen options. Training begins with individual letter names and follows a developmental sequence from letter sounds to multi-letter words and nonsense words. The use of nonsense words ensures that students are actually decoding text and not relying on sight word reading strategies.</p> <p>The Academy of Reading is built upon the theory of automaticity. This theory contends that the basic components of reading (i.e.: letters, syllables and words) must not only be learned, but learned to a very rapid skill level such that processing becomes automatic. This automaticity of response facilitates the attainment of higher level reading skills, namely comprehension. As students work in the SubSkills section of the Academy, their component reading skills are developed to the point of automaticity. They are then able to decode new text with a high degree of proficiency and fluency while attending to the meaning of the words they read.</p> <p>The paragraph content for the Academy of Reading was selected from a variety of real-world sources to help develop life skills while practicing their reading comprehension.</p> <p>The Academy of Reading Library features a variety of graded short stories and fables.</p>

In the SubSkills section of the Academy, letters, letter combinations, syllables progressing to words of different phonetic patterns, sentences and finally paragraphs are learned to a level of fluency and accuracy that ensures that the student has mastered key component skills required in becoming an effective reader. This allows the student to comprehend the greater meaning of the text he or she is reading rather than concentrate on the decoding of individual words.</p>

### GRADE FOUR TO GRADE TWELVE

Reading / Literature	<p>The student will read to learn.</p>	<p>By Grade 4, students are expected to make the transition from learning to read to reading to learn. However, some students may not have the essential foundational skills in place to make this transition. For those students experiencing difficulty keeping up with classmates, the Academy of Reading can help. By ensuring the development of phonemic awareness, decoding accuracy and fluency and comprehension strategies, the Academy of Reading enables students to attend to the meaning of the words they read.</p>
Writing	<p>The student will write to express ideas.</p>	<p>As with reading, writing in the fourth grade is expected to look much different than in earlier grades. In order for students to write effectively and meet their teacher's expectation, they must possess the ability to comprehend what they read. Without the foundational skills solidly in place, this will not occur. The Academy of Reading allows students to develop these skills and writing ability will be allowed to progress.</p>
