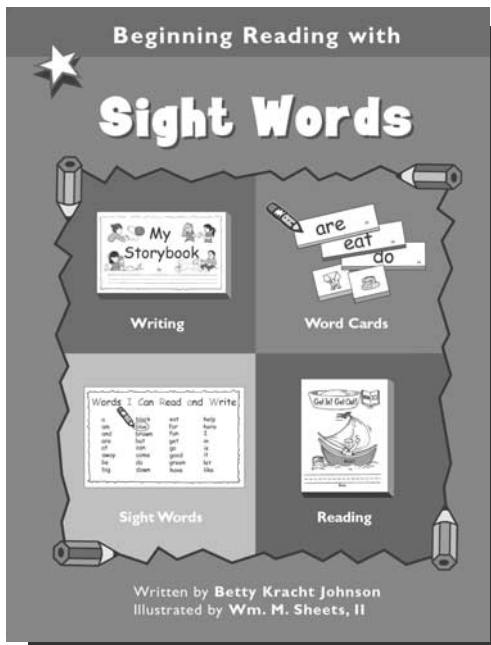




Beginning Reading with **Sight Words**

Beginning Reading with Sight Words is a blackline master that consists of 20 sight-word lessons for beginning readers. Sight word recognition is a vital component to fluency and reading comprehension. Each lesson in *Beginning Reading with Sight Words* combines 3 components: word recognition, reading, and writing.

The following **sample of Lesson 18** introduces the new sight words: come, go, ride, and on. Try it with an individual student, a small group, or the entire class. *Beginning Reading with Sight Words* can be easily incorporated into almost any curriculum.

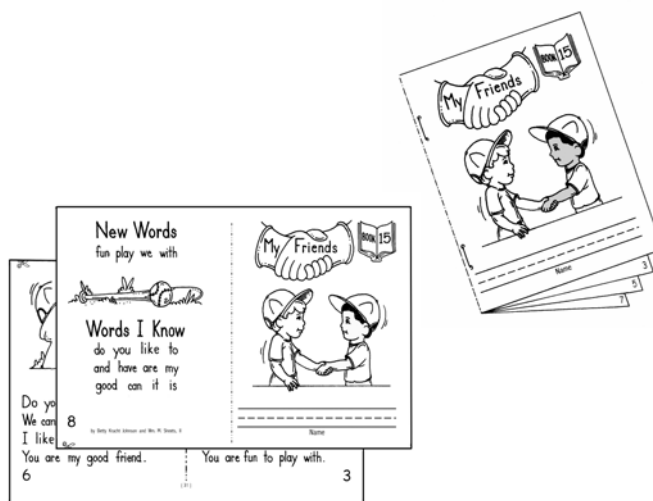

8-page Books.

Books 3 through 18 are made from one double-sided page.

1. Cut the page apart on the scissors' line.
2. The top half (New Words and Story Title) is placed on top of the bottom section (pages 6 and 3).
3. Fold on the dotted line and staple.

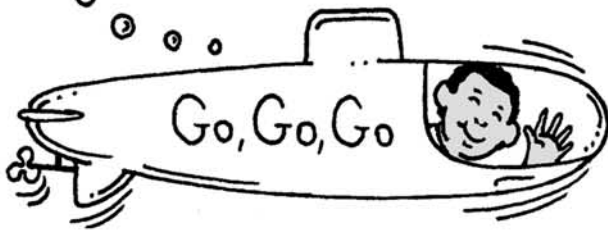


Books 4 through 20

1. Introduce a new book by name and let the students peruse it.
2. Draw attention to the New Words section on the book's last page. Hand out the numbered word cards for that particular book, teaching the new words through game play and sentence construction—using both new and old word cards and picture rebuses (see Games and Making Sentences).
3. When the students have become familiar with the new words, review Words I Know—words that occur in the current story.
4. Reading the book: Discuss the picture on the page being read and suggest a question "to read and find out," as students read silently. Reread aloud to answer the question.
5. My Storybook: The story to be written is numbered according to the book it accompanies. The writing lesson is read, discussed, written, and the picture colored.
6. My Story is the creative writing portion of the series. Children can suggest words and/or ideas for My Story and the teacher can record them on the board.

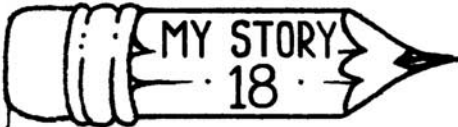

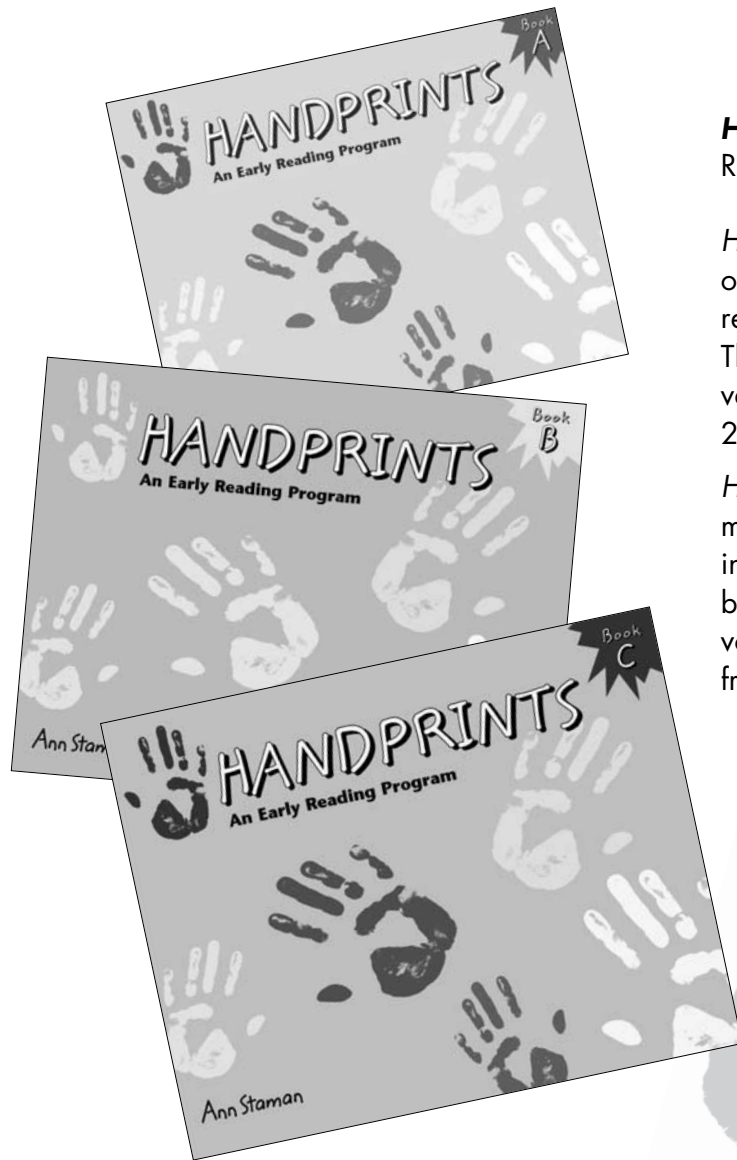
